In terms of progress, the disadvantaged pupils at Hillside are making very good progress, well above the national and in Maths and Reading they are exceeding non-disadvantaged pupils. This indicates that current support mechanisms and spending are working effectively.

With the exception of Reading in Y3, disadvantaged pupils are either performing in line with or outperforming Hillside non-disadvantaged pupils. In year 3, 3 of the 4 disadvantaged pupils are also SEN which is a limiting factor.
