# **Attendance**

Whole school attendance for last year was 96.6% which is great but we could do better!

Regular attendance is important because students are more likely to succeed when they attend school every day. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a large number of pupils are frequently absent.

Reminder: the doors open at 8.50am and close at 9.00am after which time pupils are considered late and must be escorted into school via the main entrance so that their arrival can be recorded and a dinner ordered if needed.

If your child is poorly and cannot attend school you must ring the school office on the first day of absence.

#### **Uniform Reminder**

Another reminder that children should only be wearing plain, stud gold or silver earrings in school.

Parents should refrain from fashion hairstyles such as adding lines or hair tinsel/feathers to hairstyles during term time.

Additionally, a reminder that boots should not be worn in school. If pupils wish to walk to school in boots, a pair of shoes should be brought to change into.

#### Remembrance

Thank you to the children who attended the Remembrance Service at the cenotaph at Carmountside Crematorium. We came together with pupils from Milton, Greenways and Carmountside to lay wreaths and remember those

who have fought and continued to fight in war. It was a lovely, thought-provoking occasion. The children were fantastic ambassadors for Hillside. Thank you.



Mr Frost led a Remembrance Assembly in which the significance of the poppy was discussed. Children took part in a 2 minute silence and Jack from Y6 shared a poem. The children also saw their remembrance work on display and discussed

the significance of it all. After the assembly Mr Such transported all the children's work to the church to display for the Remembrance weekends events. It looked fantastic.



#### **Reading Rocket**

The children have worked very hard again this half term, and they have improved their fluency in their times tables! #### Mosaics in Year 4

As part of their topic on the Romans, Year 4 looked at mosaics. They looked at and discussed a range of different designs and

used this knowledge to design and create their own. They thought carefully about the colours they were going to use and we are sure you will agree that they look amazing.



Year 6 have visited the Victorian village of Blist's Hill this month.
