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Parking Issues

Parents and local residents have expressed concerns about illegal and unsafe parking. Local residents have experienced difficulty leaving and entering their properties and concerns have been raised that cars are being parked unsafely on pavements. We do appreciate that the majority of our parents walk or drive responsibly to school and these are isolated instances.

The children are precious and unsafe parking could result in a serious injury or worse. Our only concern is to create a safer environment for the children, as they arrive at or leave school and one where children's safety outside school is a greater priority than convenient parking that could put

children's lives at risk, and would please ask that we all work together to achieve this.

Important Reminder: Peanut/Nut Allergies

There are children and staff in school who have a severe food allergy to peanuts/nuts. It is important that we avoid this food as best we can to prevent serious allergic reactions. We are asking for your help to provide these children and staff with a safe school environment.

Any exposure to peanuts/nuts may cause serious allergic reactions that require emergency medical treatment. To reduce the chance of this occurring we are asking that you do not send any peanut or nut containing products to school with your child for the break time snacks, in their lunchboxes or at any other times.

Bananagrams—The Rules:

Bananagrams is a word game wherein lettered tiles are used to spell words. The tiles are placed in a pile on a table, face down. Each player takes 15-20 tiles (depending on how many children are playing). Everyone turns their tiles face up at once and starts to make words, creating little free-form Scrabble boards around the table. No proper nouns are allowed, otherwise any pattern goes, as long as your words link up. The moment the first person uses up all their tiles, they shout "Peel!" and everyone has to grab another letter. This goes on until all 144 tiles are used. At any stage before the game is over a player can rearrange their letters to form new words or scrap

other ones. The winner is the first to use up all their tiles.



Hillside Bananagrams Championships

We are holding our own Bananagram Championships in school for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. The children have received a Bananagram assembly in school and will begin their in-class battles before the end of half term. During the first week back (after half term) the children from years 3 and 4 will play against each other and the children from Years 5 and 6 will battle to be crowned a Hillside Bananagram Champion.

Nursery have been learning all about growing since they have been back from the Christmas break. During this time they have sown their own seeds, planted their own beanstalk and been observing the plants that have started to shoot in the woods. The children are very excited to see them growing and quite often take a look independently and comment on how they are growing, remembering

that we need to give them water too. We are hoping to be sending some very big beanstalks home when they have reached the castles!



Year 1 have been thoroughly enjoying the start to 2019 and have been working extremely hard in lots of areas of learning! In Maths we seem to have almost cracked our 2s, 5s and 10s following Rock Star Day! In English we have written our own version of 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' using adjectives to describe our own animals. We have learned how to login and create our own work on the laptops and have talked about why we use avatars (little cartoon characters) instead of our photograph and are beginning to understand how to stay safe online. Our topic on Hot and Cold started with recorded weather reports (there are

definitely some budding actors amongst us!) and we have been back to the woods to observe seasonal change in our wellies! Phew! What a busy, fun start to the year!

Spring 1 in Year 2—It has been a very exciting half term in Year 2 with lots of exciting events happening keeping us busy. We have been reading 'Meerkat Mail' by Emily Gravett and we have written fantastic postcards in the first person! We have been amazing



scientists this half term, and we have learnt all about animals including humans.
