Dinner Money

When we return in September, we will be using the online payment system ParentPay for all school meals payments. Activation codes for current pupils have been sent out this week to enable you to set up your accounts before the new term. This will make paying funds to the school quicker, safer and more efficient. It can be done on android phones, iPads, laptops etc. www.parentpay.com

Even if you do not pay for school meals you will still need to set it up in readiness for when we include online payments for trips, clubs etc.

Please remember that on the first day back, Tuesday 5th September, you only need to pay 4 days dinner money, £9.60.

Reminder - Pupils in our current Year 2 class, upon entering Year 3 will no longer be entitled to Universal Free School Meals. If taking meals the cost will be £9.60 for the first week (4 days) and £12 each week thereafter.

Meal arrangements should remain either cooked meals or sandwiches for the full week.

SPORT & PE

We are delighted to have achieved the **School Games GOLD Mark Award** for the 2017/2018 academic year. The School Games Mark is a Government led scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

Over 40 children from Y3/Y4/Y5 competed in the Hanley Town **Athletics** competition at Birches Head High School and Northwood Stadium. Well done to the 9 children who reached the City Finals—extra special well done to Scott Williams for coming 3rd in the javelin.

15 of our Y3/Y4/Y5/Y6 children went to Northwood Stadium for the **Top Link Festival** run by sports leaders.

Megan Wood and Lewis Deaville were nominated for **Sports Leader Awards** for their Sports Crew positions at Excel Academy. Kate Wood, Izzy Wyatt, Sophie Moss and Emily Lovatt were nominated for **Leadership Awards** for their work as Playground Leaders.

Football—Yet again we have had a successful year for football. We entered both the Y3/4 and 5/6 leagues, with our Y5/6 team eventually coming 3rd in the league. We also had Stoke City coaches in weekly, help-ing with the training of our team.

Cross Country—Hillside competed in several Key Stage 2 competitions and also a Key Stage 1 competition.

On Thursday 5th July we held a whole school **Olympic themed School Games Day** event. Sports Leaders from Excel Academy organised lots of physical activities. Everyone joined in and it was a very enjoyable day.

Cycling—6 children from Y6 took park in the Burnwood Velodrome cycling competition and won!

Change4Life—We continued with an after school Change4Life Club led by Ministry4Sport focussing on healthy living and exercise.

We also continued with active after school clubs for Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 enabling them to participate in a range of **Multiskills** activities.
