<p>Monday 8th February</p> <p>Watch the Twinkle Powerpoint for the long 'oo' sound. (See link)</p> <p>Say the sounds out loud, read the tricky words, then join in with the story.</p> <p>Play the 'Mission to Moon' game attached.</p>	<p>Tuesday 9th February</p> <p>Use your sound mat to read the Phase 3 sounds up to the long 'oo'</p> <p>Sing the tricky word song from You Tube Tricky Words and Sight Words Song - YouTube</p> <p>Complete the worksheet using the long 'oo' sound.</p>	<p>Wednesday 10th February</p> <p>Watch the Twinkle Powerpoint for the short 'oo' sound. (See link)</p> <p>Say the sounds out loud, read the tricky words, then join in with the story.</p> <p>Find and read the short 'oo' words in the Phoneme Spotter. You could highlight and copy out into a list.</p>
<p>Thursday 11th February</p> <p>Use your sound mat to read the Phase 3 sounds up to 'oo'</p> <p>Sing the tricky word song from You Tube Tricky Words and Sight Words Song - YouTube</p> <p>Complete the 'Look for the right book' worksheet.</p>	<p>Friday 12th February</p> <p>Click on the link for a short video recapping the long and short 'oo' sound. Digraphs/ OO and oo / Long + Short Vowels / Phonics Song - YouTube</p> <p>Then complete the Campfire Caption Matching activity. N.B For the purposes of Phonics, we teach the long and short 'oo' sounds following the 'Letters and Sounds' guidance.</p>	<p>Monday 22nd February</p> <p>Watch the Twinkle Powerpoint for the 'ar' sound. (See link)</p> <p>Say the sounds out loud, read the tricky words, then join in with the story.</p> <p>Complete the 'ar' Colour by Phoneme Real and Nonsense Words Worksheet</p>
<p>Tuesday 23rd February</p> <p>Use your sound mat to read the Phase 3 sounds up to 'ar'</p> <p>Sing the tricky word song from You Tube Tricky Words and Sight Words Song - YouTube</p> <p>Make your own Stardust using a light sprinkling of salt and glitter (if you have it) on a plate. Using a pencil as a wand – you could add a star at the end, write the following words in your stardust. Light, week, food, tail, soap, good, etc.</p>	<p>Wednesday 24th February</p> <p>Watch the Twinkle Powerpoint for the 'or' sound. (See link)</p> <p>Say the sounds out loud, read the tricky words, then join in with the story.</p> <p>Complete the 'Guess the gift' worksheet.</p>	<p>Thursday 25th February</p> <p>Use your sound mat to read the Phase 3 sounds up to 'or'</p> <p>Sing the tricky word song from You Tube Tricky Words and Sight Words Song - YouTube</p> <p>Complete the 'ar' 'or' word game on Purple Mash Purple Mash by 2Simple</p>
