Year 2 Summer Term: This Is Me!



Termly overview: Over the Summer Term, year 2 will be exploring all things related to themselves. They will look at the history of Stoke-on -Trent and some of it's famous residents. They will also learn about how their bodies (as well as animals and plants) grow and develop.

They will look at William Turner, learn how different religions celebrate special times with their families and learn about how coding can lead to future jobs.




As Times Table Rockstars we will:

be learning the multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. It is the expectation that children can answer these questions in under 6 seconds by the end of year 2. The children should be able to recall them at speed and this will be practised throughout the week in class. Times Table Rockstars is a great way for children to practise these at home.

As writers we will:

be focusing on two books: The Enormous Crocodile by Roald Dahl and The Rainbow Bear by Michael Morpurgo. We will also focus on repetitive poems and stories from our author of the term. The children will be continuing to develop a range of skills, but will learn how to use commas in a list and the names of the various sentence types as new skills.



As mathematicians we will:



be focusing on a range of topics. Most of these will build on objectives learnt in the Autumn and Spring Term with some new objectives as well. We will cover place value, addition and subtraction, fractions, measurement, shape and statistics objectives. We will also be looking at telling the time and combining coins to make various amounts — these are great topics that can be practised at home when the opportunity presents itself

As scientists we will:

look at the growth of animals, humans and plants. We will explore the various stages of growth and what is needed to keep them alive and healthy.



As historians we will:

be exploring the historic past of Stoke-on-Trent. We will look at how jobs have changed and why Stoke-on-Trent was well known around the world.



As designers we will:

be creating a moon buggy for Neil Armstrong to use on the moon.




As artists we will:

Reading

In Year 2, the expectation is that children read at least three times per week. You must sign and date your child's diary and ensure it is in school each day. In Year 2, books will be changed on a Friday. Reading diaries will be checked every Friday morning. In addition to this expectation, we are continuing the 'Reading Rocket' initiative for children. Children are encouraged to read at least five times over the week. In order to develop good reading habits we are asking that children read little and often throughout the week rather than on a number of occasions during the same day. The children must read on five separate days to be considered for the reading rocket prize. Those who achieve the reading rocket will receive a letter home, a small prize and be in entered into a prize draw for a larger prize.
